Ordering:

A. Overwintering Stock – as of 20 March 2025

NOTE: At this point, we are still overwintering citrus plants and other items and recommend you wait to pick them up until mid to late **April / May**.

IF, however, it is important to you to pick up the plants earlier, be prepared to still protect them until the weather is warm enough for them to be planted outside.

1. General Items -- in 2 gal pots unless otherwise indicated

Chilean Guava – 1 & 2 gal (April / May)

Feijoa (aka Pineapple Guava) – Anatoki, Kaiteri, Takaka, Unique (**recommend 2 different varieties for pollination) – all 2 gal

Fig – Desert King – 3 gal

Goji – Crimson Star, Firecracker – all 2 gal (April / May)

Kiwi – Hardy Red (female) – 2 gal ('kiwiberries' - **needs Hardy Male for pollination)

Kiwi (fuzzy, regular)* – Saanichton (female) – 1 gal (* needs male for pollination) (April)

Kiwi – Matua (male) – 1 gal (to pollinate Saanichton) (April)

Olive – Black Pearl, Harvest Joy, Leccino, Nikita Jubilee, Perpetua, Universal (**recommend 2 different varieties for pollination) – all 2 gal

Pomegranates – Crimson Sky, Favorite – all 1 gal (avail May)

Feijoa (aka Pineapple Guava) – Coolidge (10 gal) Mammoth (20 gal)

2. Citrus - 1 gal or 2 gal pots

Although citrus can be grown in pots, we recommend planting in the ground if possible.

Siting for planting citrus:

- Meyer Lemons, Bearss Limes – best against south-facing wall under a glass, poly or fiberglass overhang (west-facing ok too).
- Sudachi and Yuzu can be grown outside ‘in the open’ in a hot spot.
- Satsuma mandarins can be grown against a hot, south-facing wall or in a minimally heated greenhouse or tunnel.
- **Other** citrus are best grown in an unheated greenhouse.

We will provide planting information when citrus are purchased.

Information is usually sent in early fall on strategies and supplies for winterization protection.

Keep in mind, you may need to adjust for your planting location and growing conditions compared with ours.

Bearss Lime (aka Persian) – 2 gal
Cocktail Grapefruit (aka Mandalo) – 2 gal
Meiwa Kumquat– 1 gal
Meyer Lemon– 1 gal (probably avail May)
Seville Orange - 2 gal
Sudachi Hardy Citrus– 1 gal
Washington Navel Orange– 1 gal

3. Supplies for sale

We sell both remay and pre-wired thermostats to help with growing and **winterizing your citrus**

- 1) **Remay**- aka floating row cover. Recommend double or triple layers for maximum effectiveness.
- 2) **Thermostats** – weatherproof enclosure; pre-wired, 8 ft cord with piggyback plug. Use with standard 110/120 volt outlet. Temperature range 30°F – 110°F. Can be set just above 0°C (32°F) to turn on Christmas lights when the temperature drops to freezing.

B. Additional trees expected for this year – most in early June

1. General – 1 gal pots

Feijoa (aka Pineapple Guava) – Anatoki, Kaiteri, Kakariki, Marion, Ramsey, Takaka, Unique (**recommend 2 different varieties for pollination)
Kiwi (kiwiberries, ‘hardy’)* – Anna (female)
Kiwi (kiwiberries, ‘hardy’) – Male (**to pollinate Hardy Females)
Medlar - Breda Giant, Westerveld

Illinois Mulberry – Illinois, Pakistan

Olive - Black Pearl, Harvest Joy, Leccino, Nikita Jubilee, Perpetua, Premier, Universal
(*recommend 2 different varieties for pollination)

Pawpaw * - KSU-Atwood, KSU-Benson, NC-1, Pennsylvania Golden

Persimmon – Cardinal, Early Fuyu, Early Jiro, Saijo

Pomegranate - Crimson Sky, Favorite, Parfianka

Tea – Korean

Note ***These need pollinators** – either a male (for kiwi) or another variety (feijoa, pawpaw)
